### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

#### Eve Contact

### **Personal Protective Equipment**

#### Eye and face protection:

Wear chemical goggles with splash shields or face shield. Contact lenses should not be worn when working with chemicals because contact lenses may contribute to the severity of an eye injury in case of exposure.

#### Skin protection:

Appropriate chemical resistant gloves should be worn.

### **Other Personel Protection Data:**

Ensure that eyewash stations and safety showers are close to the workstation location. To prevent skin contact wear protective clothing covering all exposed areas.

### **Respiratory protection:**
